## Dear Parents and Carers

Penola Catholic College has been advised that two students who were last onsite on Friday October 29, 2021 have tested positive for coronavirus and is awaiting confirmation from the Department of Health (DH).

Following advice from Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS), Penola Catholic College has identified all primary close contacts who have had close contact with the cases.

If we inform you that your child has been identified as a primary close contact, please ensure that your child limits their movement until you are contacted by the Department of Health directly. These calls or text messages can come from private or unknown numbers. Please answer these calls or follow the text message advice.

The rest of your family does not need to limit their movement at this stage.

If you or anyone in your family develop even the mildest of symptoms, please get tested. If you need to get tested, please check <u>coronavirus.vic.gov.au</u> for up-to-date information about <u>waiting times at testing</u> sites across the state.

I understand this news will be concerning for many of you. I want to assure you we are doing everything we can to contain and slow the spread of the virus and ensure the health and safety of our whole school community.

Please be aware that we cannot provide information about the persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 and I ask that you respect their privacy.

As a result, 7D and 7H homerooms will resume remote learning for Thursday 4 November and Friday 5 November. Classes will resume on Monday 8 November 2021 for all double vaccinated students and staff associated with these classes, but remote learning will continue to be provided for those students who remain in isolation.

I will continue to keep you informed as further updates become available.
